The chances of finding a matching donor are much higher within the same race & ethnicity. Since there aren't as many South Asians (people from India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, etc.) registered in the National Marrow Registry, the possibility of a match is very less for patients of Indian origin.

We urge you to attend the bone marrow matching drive mentioned below or contact us to see how you can save his life. The test for marrow match is very simple - just an oral swab, not even a blood draw and it is absolutely FREE!!

Once a match is found, the bone marrow donation is a simple procedure with no long-term side effects. In the most current procedure, the donor's blood is drawn from one arm, passed through a machine that separates out the cells used in transplantation and the remaining blood is returned through the other arm. The whole outpatient procedure takes about 2-3 hours.
